

Feedback by Staff on Curriculum: 2023-24- An Analysis

The Standard Fireworks Rajaratnam College for Women has always been engaged in the continuous and systematic process of obtaining feedback from all the stakeholders of the institution. Teachers' feedback is an essential parameter for the enhancement of the curriculum for the betterment of student community. The feedback was collected online through the college website using separate links with separate individual Login IDs for staff members and the statistical analysis of the responses was automatically generated. All the 153staff members submitted their online feedback forms comprising 10 questions. The feedback is overall focused on the curriculum, outcome based education, competencies, skills and knowledge of the SFRCians. The responses received from the staff are presented graphically for the year 2023-24. The consolidated report of the feedbacks received is presented here.

Outcome Based Education gives a clear view of needs to be accomplished by the completion of the Courses and the Programme

Feedback from curriculum enhances the quality of education by Identifying the expectations of faculty towards the curriculum, fosteringprofessional development and Improving teaching methodologies. 90 facultystrongly agreed that Outcome Based Education gives a clear view of needs to be accomplished by the completion of the Courses and the Programme and 61 of the faculty agreed the statement.





The learning outcomes of the courses are well defined and efforts are being taken for the effective accomplishment of outcomes.

The Learning Outcome Based Education, a student-centric methodology, focuses on spotting the strengths and weakness of students through the assessment of attainment of every learning outcomes. 93 faculty strongly agreed that learning outcomes of the courses are well defined and efforts are being constantly taken for the effective accomplishment of outcomes and the remaining 60 faculty agreed the same.

The prescribed text books and reference materials are relevant, updated and cover the entire syllabus.

Text books and Reference books are a very useful aspect for exploring the course content. Materials are to be revised and updated regularly to align with changes in educational standards and updates in the field of study.147 faculty are of the opinion that the prescribed text books and reference materials are relevant and they are updated regularly and 6 of the faculty are of the opinion that the books and materials are revised often.





Syllabus is need based and relevant to the

Syllabus design in the educational system should be based on a needs analysis of students. This involves systematically investigating the needs of students to design a course. Altogether121 Faculty are of the opinion that the Syllabus is need based and relevant to the course while the remaining 32 members agreed the statement.


Curricula equip the students with the relevant employability skills.




The Programme carries sufficient number of optional papers.


Part V programmes initiate the students to be socially responsible for the betterment and empowerment of the society




Term Tests and Examinations are conducted on time with the proper coverage of all units in the syllabus.
